



## **Your INL Update — Week of July 26, 2010**

The summer sun will beat a little less harshly on the roofs of several Idaho National Laboratory buildings this year. Cool roofs can lower energy costs by using more reflective material to deflect some of the sun's rays. Six INL buildings due for roof replacements next month will get cool roofs, including the National Historic Landmark Experimental Breeder Reactor-I.

For the second year in a row, the National Safety Council has named an INL bus driver as its Safe Driver of the Year for the eight-state Rocky Mountain Region. Joel Wright started working at INL in 1972 and documented nearly 1.4 million safe driving miles before he retired recently. Three other INL drivers earned awards of honor at the competition.

INL is supporting efforts to improve the greenbelt by sponsoring the 20<sup>th</sup> annual Quacker Backer. The corporate duck race is Friday at the Idaho Falls Country Club. The event has helped the Downtown Idaho Falls Rotary Club raise more than \$1.2 million for greenbelt projects.
